When we lost two people off the team in one month, Gary is the one who stayed late and covered it without mentioning it to anyone above him. Every single person hired onto this team since 2014 has had Gary walk into their cubicle in the first week, sit down uninvited, and ask them how they were actually doing.

There was a conference in Phoenix where the fire alarm went off at four in the morning, and I came out into the parking lot to find Gary in a hotel robe, taking attendance. Actual attendance. Counting us.

Coach, you're sixty today. You've got a truck in your garage that has been almost finished for six years, a fishing spot you refuse to tell any of us the location of, and a grandson who is going to be a much better shortstop than you were.

My wish for you is that the countdown to retirement moves slower than you expect, because a lot of us aren't ready.

Everybody, raise whatever you've got. Even if it's a chipped mug.
