She teaches for a living, which surprises nobody who has ever watched her explain something. She has a garden that has no business producing what it produces. And she walks. Miles and miles, most weekends, usually alone, which is the only hour of the week she takes for herself.

That's actually what I want to say about fifty.

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Michelle has spent twenty five years making sure other people's lives worked. Students, our kids, her mother, me. And fifty is a good moment to turn some of that around.

So my wish for this year is simple and I'm saying it in front of sixty witnesses so it's harder to ignore. More hours that belong only to you. More walks. More mornings where nobody needs anything.

Mama Okafor, thank you for flying in. Thank you for her.

Everyone, would you stand with me.
