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Hi everybody. I'm Alex. Rob and I met in the year 2000 at a job we both hated, which is the strongest foundation a friendship can have.

There's a table in his living room he built by hand. There's a bike in the garage with more miles on it than my car. There's a shelf of action movies that no reasonable adult should own.

And there are two teenagers standing over there who are turning out steady and funny and kind, which is not luck.

Pete, you're fifty. You've spent twenty five years being the person other people call, and you've never once made the call yourself.

So here's my wish, and I want everyone here to hold you to it. This year, let somebody do something for you. Let it be awkward. Let it happen anyway.

Everyone, please raise a glass.
